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Igor Antonov Rehearsal Director; Richmond Ballet

Igor Antonov was born in Zaporizhzhia, Ukraine. Upon graduation from the Kiev Choreographic Institute, he joined the Donetsk Ballet (Ukraine) as a soloist. In 1990, he was invited to join Richmond Ballet, where for five seasons he danced leading roles in works by George Balanchine, John Butler, Antony Tudor, William Soleau, Malcolm Burn, and Stoner Winslett. During that time, he was also a medalist and best couple award winner at the International Ballet Competition in Jackson, Mississippi. For the next several years, he danced with Deutsche Oper am Rhein in Dusseldorf, Germany, and made guest appearances with major ballet companies in Berlin, Madrid, and Nice. Returning to Richmond Ballet in

2003 for the remainder of his professional career, he also began conducting rehearsals and teaching at the School of Richmond Ballet. When Mr. Antonov retired from the stage, he accepted the leadership role for Richmond Ballet's second company, Richmond Ballet II, and served the Ballet as an Artistic Associate and Studio Company Director. In 2024 he started in a new role as Rehearsal Director for the professional company.





A native of Libertyville, Illinois, Amy has been the editor-in chief of Pointe since 2014. She danced professionally with the Milwaukee Ballet and The Suzanne Farrell Ballet, among others, performing a large repertoire that included 19th century classics and works by George Balanchine, Antony Tudor, Jerome Robbins and Alonzo King. Amy also performed in honor of Ms. Farrell at the 2005 Kennedy Center Honors. In 2009, she began writing Pointe's "Ask Amy" advice column. Amy graduated summa cum laude from Marymount Manhattan College with a BA in English and World Literatures in 2014, and she has served on the department's advisory board. She is also senior consulting editor for Dance Teacher.



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DaYoung Jung

OKC Ballet, Rehearsal Director

DaYoung Jung, from South Korea, trained at Moscow's Bolshoi Ballet Academy, graduating with honors with masters degree in Ballet Pedagogy. She was a semifinalist in the Serge Lifar International Ballet Competition held in Donetsk, Ukraine, in 2006. Jung joined Oklahoma City Ballet in 2012, was promoted to soloist in 2014, and to principal in 2017. Throughout her career, Jung has performed the title roles of many of the great classics, such as Giselle, Romeo & Juliet, Swan Lake, The Firebird, Cinderella, and The Sleeping Beauty, as well as works by George Balanchine, Jiří Kylián, Septime Webre, Toni Pimble, Twyla Tharp, Michael Pink, Robert Mills, and many others. Her vast repertoire made her an accomplished dancer and also gave her a springboard to find her voice as a choreographer, launching her into a new branch of her career. Jung gave her final performance with Oklahoma City Ballet as Aurora in *The Sleeping Beauty* in May 2022 after 10 years with the company. Transitioning away from the stage, Jung became a rehearsal director at Oklahoma City Ballet. She is also a dance educator who has been invited as a panelist by Ballet Des Moines to speak on moving arts

and dances and has lent her expertise as a judge at ADC/IBC final in 2023. She has already established herself behind the scenes of the ballet, and also as an award-winning choreographer. Her choreographic works have graced stages across the nation. She was invited to present her work *Dissipation* at The Five Moons Dance Festival in August 2021. The following year, she presented her work, *Composition*. In 2022, *Vignettes* was chosen as the audience's favorite of the Milwaukee Ballet's competition, Genesis: International Choreographic Competition. Her most recent work, *There*, *Never There* was performed by Oklahoma City Ballet in 2023 at *Ballet Under The Stars*, a free performance for the entire Oklahoma City metropolitan area at Scissortail Park.



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Alexey Kulpin
The Harid Conservatory, Faculty Member

Alexey Kulpin is a graduate of the University of Culture and Art in St. Petersburg, Russia. He holds both bachelor's and master's degrees in ballet methodology and choreography. In 1998, he was the Grand Prix winner at the Muse of St. Petersburg Ballet Competition.

As a professional dancer, Mr. Kulpin has performed soloist and principal roles in both classical and contemporary ballets in Russia, Israel, and the United States. He danced professionally with St. Petersburg State Opera Ballet, St. Petersburg State Male Theatre by Mihailovsky, Ballet Israel, City Ballet of San Diego, Grand Rapids Ballet, Charleston Ballet Theater, Stars of St. Petersburg Municipal

Theater of Music and Dance, and Krasnoyarsk Dance Ensemble. His roles included Basilio in Don Quixote; James in La Sylphide; Prince Ivan in Firebird; Spirit of the Rose in Le Spectre de la Rose; Swan Lake Pas de Trois; and the male leads in Tarentella and Maurice Bejart's Trik Trak.
